Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near. ⁹ Beloved, do not grumble against one another, so that you may not be judged. See, the Judge is standing at the doors! ¹⁰ As an example of suffering and patience, beloved, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. ¹¹ Indeed we call blessed those who showed endurance. You have heard of the endurance of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful. James 5:7-11

Greetings Sisters and Brothers of Holy Cross,

We have many wants in our lives. Some are stronger than others and we may describe those feelings of want in stronger terms such as 'yearning' or 'long for.' The beautiful Psalm verse cited above uses an emotionally powered image of thirst, 'As a deer <u>longs for</u> flowing water' then reads 'so my soul <u>longs for</u> you, O God.'

We know God is present with us all the time but there are times we feel a need to know God's presence even stronger. In these times of pandemic, more isolation, and more political turmoil our self defense mechanisms may kick in. Flight, fight, or freeze. For us in faith, we turn to the Lord. We <u>long for</u> God's intervention.

Some may 'fight' in verbal or physically violent ways. Some may try to run away and hide and deny. We resign to thinking 'well, 'que sera, sera; what will be, will be' and go on as if no danger exists or just ignore because we think we are immune to the danger. Some may freeze. Go into an isolation, 'frozen in fear,' until the plague passes over and we can feel safe enough to come out.

I am pleased to see in our congregations and congregations around the world with yet another kind of response to our changing hurting world. In the world, we humbly acknowledge we have our sin and sickness and that there are all sorts of changes and challenges but also God is with us. God inspires us to 'fight' not in fearful mean-spirited ways, not to take flight, nor go into a freeze mode. Some examples. We still yearn to come together for worship but with great care, especially when for 'in-person' worship. Be it 'in-person' in the pew with a bunch of safety guidelines or online on the couch or in a chair, we yearn for and recognize that we are together as the spiritual body of Christ which is called 'the church.'

We yearn for continuing God's works of compassion. We do not shut down and hide but are determined to meet greater challenges with greater resolve and creativity in our yearning to make a difference. Food Pantries have new procedures to deal with but we change and continue to go on with compassion by reaching out. The Holy Cross Fall Festival and Garage Sale will have to make changes but it will still happen. The Blessing Box at Christ by the Lake had some issues but it was not simply shut down and removed but rather we looked at new options and are in the process of setting up a new Blessing Box. The Soup Sisters 'Crazy Bowl' event will have to make changes but are determined to make those changes in order to go on. Our Sunday worship has changed but we have added Facebook which reaches some people the in-person services never reached.

We yearn to serve our Lord so our ministries go on. We 'long for' all to know the Lord and his goodness.

'For I was hungry and you'... did not take a break to wait until the storms passed but stepped forward into the storms in faith.

Longing with you we are patient and endure the difficulties for our Lord is compassionate and merciful.

There were 5 members and 1 guest Mer's fellowship present. We made final plans for the Men's Garage Sale/Women's

Bazaar on October 2nd & 3rd. The sale will be held from 8am-2pm both days. Coffee and cinnamon buns will be served in the morning and hot dogs, sloppy joes, and chicken salad for lunch.

We decided that we will no longer collect aluminum cans. The low price being offered does not justify the work we put into preparing and transporting them.

We voted to help defray the cost of renovating the ladies bathroom, so when the full cost is determined, we will pay the final installment.

The next meeting will be Saturday, October 17 at 9:00am. All men are welcome.



SOCIAL MINISTRIES

In August, we served 11 households (22 clients) which included 5 new families. Six were between the ages of 0-18; 14 between the ages of

19-24; and 2 over the age of 65. Our food pantry volunteers worked a total of 113 hours.

The Food Bank of Norfork provided fresh produce and dairy products free of charge during the month of August which were distributed to our clients and congregation. On August 12, in partnership with Ozark Center of Hope, the Engage Church of Mountain Home distributed free dairy and produce items to food agencies and the public, HCLCFP included.

Barb Kampen participated in three Zoom sessions with the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas during the month of August. As a result, the HCLC Food Pantry will receive a one year membership with the Arkansas Hunger Relief Alliance and a capacity building grant opportunity in January 2021. Marita Stanford attended an 8 hour ServSafe manager's training on August 18 in Mountain Home. All food agencies are required to receive certification.


The Food Pantry expenses in August were \$95.24 and deposits totaling \$100 were given to the HCLC Food Pantry. The food pantry's current checking account balance as of 8/31/2020 is \$3,514.02. The current credit balance available on our Food Bank of North Central Arkansas account as of 8/28/2020 is \$829.15.

We received 64.23 pounds of donated food from individuals and 21.26 pounds of donated baked goods from Harps. The food donation Item for the month of October will be cereal.




