## GIVING THANKS

*26 While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body."*

*27 Then he took a cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. 28 This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. 29 I tell you, I will not drink from this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom." 30 When they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. ## WORD OF WARNING

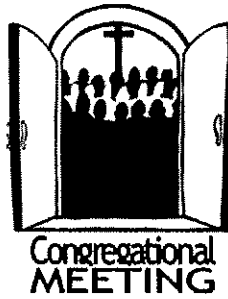

## SOCIAL MINISTRIES

In September, we served 20 households (52 clients) which included 7 new families. Seventeen were between the ages of 0-18; thirty-four between the ages of 19-64; and one over the age of 65. Our food pantry volunteers worked a total of 90.75 hours.

The Food Bank of Norfolk provided fresh produce and dairy products free of charge during the month of September which was distributed to our clients and congregation. HCLCFP received dairy and fresh produce from the drive-thru distribution at the Great Escapes RV Center in Gassville on September 16th. Many local churches partnered with this event which distributed the dairy and fresh produce to local churches, food pantries, and the public.

With the approval of HCLC council, the September 16th renewal of the food pantry's CD with Bank OZK resulting in keeping \$5,000 in and with withdrawing \$2,359.57. The new maturity date for the CD is 8/16/2021 with a .9010 interest rate. The \$2,359.57 was deposited into the HCLCFP checking account with First Security Bank.

We received 130.64 pounds of donated food from individuals and 15.88 pounds of donated baked goods from Harps. The food donation item for the month of November will be Jam or Jelly.

Our expenses for the food pantry in September totaled \$72.25 and deposits totaled \$2,494.57 which included the withdrawal of \$2,359.57. The current balance of the HCLCFP checking account with First Security Bank as of 9/30/2020 is \$5,936.34. The current credit balance available on our Food Bank of North Central Arkansas account is \$829.15 as of 9/30/2020.

**FINANCIAL REPORTS:** Steve Kampen gave the financial report and Charles Polacek gave the treasurers report. Wanda Soutter made a motion to pass the financial reports, seconded by Ron Westergaard, motion carried.

**MINUTES:** none were presented

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor has contacted Tim Koenig to fill in for September 27. We will alternate Advent Wednesday services with Christ by the Lake. There will be no soup fellowship hour. A motion to pay Tim Koenig, Pulpit supply per Synod guidelines and approve pastor's report was made by Louise Sellenriek and Second by Wanda Soutter. Motion carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Care Center Ministries agreement was signed for \$600 a month, for 6 months. A savings of \$600 a year over a weekly agreement. They will be paid the first Tuesday of every month for previous month. Cleaning schedule is Tuesdays 9 to 12. Holy Cross will supply cleaning supplies. First cleaning supplies totaled \$101.68 payable to Ron Westergaard.

- Council openings are 3 seats for 3 year terms. Finished are Sandy Maier, Dorothy Meyer and Dan Schmidt. There are 3 interim council members, Charles, Judy and Joyce. If the interims are willing to stay, they will also need to be voted on at the Annual Membership Meeting November 22, 2020. A member may serve two 3-year terms consecutively.

**NEW BUSINESS:** We received a \$5000 anonymous donation. Last payment to Pastor O'Shea will be October 1<sup>st</sup>. All offerings must be tracked for ELCA grant purpose. Please use your assigned church envelopes. The tracking will start August 30 until we reach \$3000. August 30, September 6 and September 11 batch reports will be given to Judy Hoover for grant purposes.

- Committee budget reports must be given to Keesha for council review. The budget will be presented to the membership November 8, 2020. The Annual Membership Meeting will be November 22, 2020 following worship service. We need at least 25 members present for the annual meeting. Pastor will work on getting an actual membership count. The count will need to be presented the Synod and to ELCA in January.

- ◆ If you are the last person out of church, you can check to make sure all the lights are off, the heat set to unoccupied, and all doors are locked.



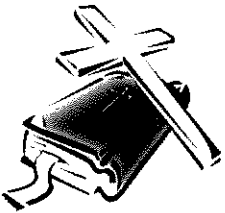

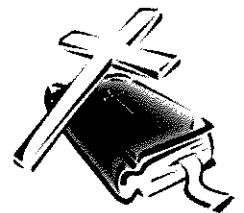

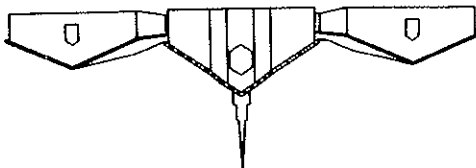
