## Power Struggles, Power of Pandemic, and Power of God

Ephesians 6:10-18(NRSV) The Whole Armor of God

*<sup>10</sup> Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. <sup>11</sup> Put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. <sup>12</sup> For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. <sup>13</sup> Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. <sup>14</sup> Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. <sup>15</sup> As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. <sup>16</sup> With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. <sup>17</sup> Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. <sup>18</sup> Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints.*

While power struggles have been going on pretty much since the time of Adam and Eve, it seems like we have seen a disheartening amount of political power struggles during the last couple of years and is continuing today. Added to political power struggles this past year we have had to contend with a pandemic power struggle. A tiny virus has caused a lot of damage in the deaths of millions plus taken tolls of emotional grief and fears, and economic hardships for the world. For our part in this power struggle against the virus we have fought back with weapons of masks, distancing apart, sanitizers, and now we have vaccines. I heard a news report that medical science is closer to a pill form of a Covid vaccine. That would be great, as while I like to think of myself as more macho and I do not like being a wimp, the shot hurt and I will have my second shot on May 5<sup>th</sup>. Please get the vaccine asap if you have not yet. As you do you might say a prayer like as I did when feeling the shot then bruise for days—"Die you little virus, die!" The power struggle goes on, but it looks like the tide is changing against this particular Covid foe. In the power struggle of health we have amazing modern medical science knowledge for weapons to battle against elements that threaten and harm our health.

Jesus had to contend with political power struggles and with diseases that attacked the human condition. Jesus healed many from various types of sickness but his primary battle to contend with was not just 'flesh and blood' but a spiritual power battle. He contended with the power brokers from Jewish Jerusalem leaders to Pilate, Herod, and the Caesar powers out of Rome. For days and nights, it looked like Jesus lost the war but then God and the resurrection turned the tide of the power war forever. While we live our lives before the final victory, we will have both our joys and our battle wounds. God offers us a whole armor suit to not only survive but thrive in this life as we live toward the eternal life. In Romans 8 (read verses 31-39) questions are posed: 'Who is to condemn?' and 'Who will separate us from the love of God?' The answer is 'in all these things we are more than conquerors and nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.'

The Psalmist in the chapter 73 verse 26 reads: "*My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever.*"

For the power struggles and challenges we face individually and as congregations however strong or weak we may feel, we can be thankful we can turn to our Lord God. We can call upon the Holy Spirit to help us put on the whole armor of God. In or past pandemics or whatever the circumstances God is our strength and joy as we go forward. Bless you and may you bless others in the name of Christ.

In March, we served eleven households (23 clients) which included one new family. Eight were between the ages of 0-18; twelve between the ages of 19-64; and three over the age of 65. Our food pantry volunteers worked a total of 94.5 hours.

Our food pantry received 59.97 lbs. of donated baked goods from Harp's and 24.90 lbs. of donated goods from individuals. All donated goods and money are greatly appreciated for our food pantry to be able to serve Baxter County families in need of food. The food pantry is in need of Jam/Jelly for the month of May.

Our expenses for the food pantry in March totaled \$137.41 and deposits totaled \$300.00. The current balance of the HCLCFP checking account with First Security bank is \$5,803.42 as of 3/31/21. The current credit balance with the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas is \$1,019.62.

### FYI From the Altar Guild

#### *The Day of Pentecost*

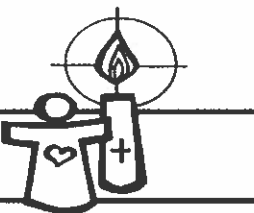
The third most important festival of the church year is Pentecost, which occurs fifty days after Easter. Pentecost celebrates the time when the Holy Spirit came to believers. It is therefore, the day when decorations and ceremonies should suggest sound and fire as symbols of the spirit.

Bright red paraments are used on the day of Pentecost. Red gladioli may be used for altar flowers, since their shape suggests tongues of fire. To emphasize the importance of this festival, the chancel may be adorned with geraniums. They should be arranged to call attention to the altar. Following Pentecost worship services, the geraniums may be planted on the church grounds.

Holy Communion is normally celebrated on this festival.

#### *The Holy Trinity*

This festival occurs on the first Sunday after Pentecost, and it honors the doctrine of the Trinity. Paraments are white, and white altar flowers are fitting.



#### Red Geraniums

If you would like to adorn the altar with your red geraniums, please bring them on Saturday, May 22nd and take them home after church service Sunday, May 23rd. Thanks and any questions, call Carol W. at 488-5044.

- **Keisha's mom's memorial.** Joyce made a motion to donate \$50 for a memorial. Wanda seconded, motion carried.

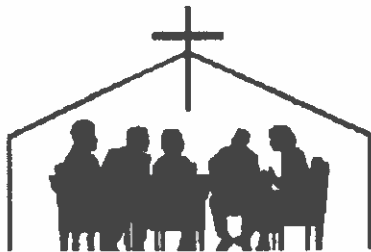
- Quilting, Chair Yoga, and Bible study will resume.

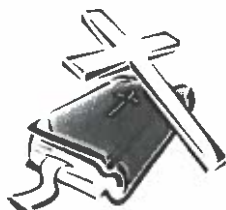

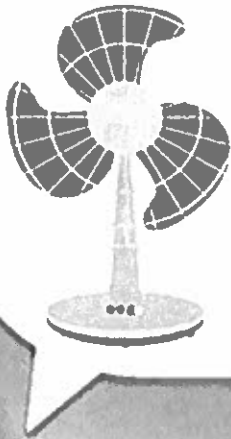
-**Bible Study on Wednesdays** at 10:00am. We study Christian reading materials and enjoy fellowship.
