For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven. -Ecclesiastes 3:1

Mid-Summer Reflection
Looking at the July mid-summer schedules in the newsletters of many congregations you can see there are fewer activities going on in contrast to the other seasons. I understand we all need a season of rest from the usual level of calendar activities however any congregation that is inactive other than Sunday morning is missing out. There are community members and visitors to our area that could use words of welcome and acts of kindness from any of us.

An introduction note to Timothy in a study Bible reads "The letters to Timothy and Titus are called "The Pastoral Epistles since they deal with the qualifications and duties of church ministers."

I cite Second Tmothy 4:1-5. In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: <sup>2</sup> proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage with the utmost patience in teaching. 3 For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound teaching, but, having their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires 4 and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. 5 As for you, be sober in everything, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

While this is focused on helping young Timothy and other 'ministers' it is helpful to consider that this encouragement applies to 'the priesthood of all believers' which includes all of us, 'ordained' pastors as well as lay church members.

I urge all to be sure to find rest during this summer season (even God rested)) and also witness with God's care in all seasons to 'be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable.' Living in abundant grace has no off season. Thank you for carrying on with worship and various ministries and always being alert to possible moments you can influence another life with God's love.

Holy Cross Lutheran Church's mission is to reach out to all people with the Gospel of Christ:

**ROLL CALL:** David Deterding, Frank Fusco, Judy Hoover, Steve Kampen, Kathy Owen, Charles Polacek, Lisa Streu, Carol Wheeler, Rod Zuck.

Excused absence: Pastor Sherman Gordius, Dave Hahn, Kathy Scott

Observers: None

**DEVOTIONS:** Steve Kampen read devotions from *Our Daily Bread*. The passage was from Isaiah and spoke of God renewing the earth and we should live in harmony with the earth. Devotions in June will be given by Charles Polacek.

**FINANCIAL REPORTS:** Steve Kampen, financial secretary, gave the giving report. Average monthly giving for April and the year are in line with the budget. Charles Polacek, church treasurer, gave the financial report. There was a recent transfer of funds to the Mission Plus account, but finances are such that he will be making another transfer to Mission Plus shortly. Expenses are in line with the budget. Discussion of property valuations occurred. Kathy Scott made a motion to approve the financial reports, and this was seconded by Carol Wheeler. The motion was passed unanimously.

**MINUTES:** Minutes from the April council meeting were reviewed, and a typographical error was found. Frank Fusco made a motion to accept the corrected minutes, which was seconded by Steve Kampen. The motion passed unanimously.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** A written report was sent by Pastor Sherman. Judy Hoover commented that he will see his medical providers on 5/10/24, and any further decisions on when and how he can come back after that.

**VISIONING:** Judy Hoover presented an idea to explore a committee that because of the age of the congregation, we should do checks on single people in the congregation and those with no relatives living close to them that haven't come to church recently. Discussion followed and the council will follow up on this idea.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** Sign update: Property committee was contacted by the sign company, and they expected that the sign would be installed this week or next week, weather permitting.

Parcel update: A written copy of the contract drawn up and signed by the landowner was given to council. Discussion ensued and it was agreed that the contract was beneficial to both the church and the landowner. The landowner would pay for all costs associated with the sale of the land (including surveyor costs) as well as costs for registering the sale and surveyor descriptions. Charles Polacek made a motion to accept the contract, which was seconded by Steve Kampen. The motion passed unanimously and closing expected around July 18, 2024. Judy Hoover will sign the contract as representative of the church and contact the landowner.

The Narcan policy is being finalized, we are waiting for clarification of Good Samaritan laws.

Rod will speak with Dan regarding using hymnals rather than printing songs in bulletins. Discussion occurred regarding people being able to read hymnals, as we have no large print hymnals.

Projection screen discussion continued. The reasons for installing them would be for information in bulletins, pastor use to emphasize information and illustrate points during sermon, etc. Discussion regarding cost, need for people to staff this every Sunday, and people to put the information into a usable format to project onto the screen. Steve Kampen made a motion to table this discussion for now until a new pastor comes under contract, seconded by Rod Zuck. Motion passed unanimously.

Discussion was had regarding keeping the doors by the office locked when someone is in the office to reduce the need for them to keep getting up to unlock the door; decided to keep same policy.,

**NEW BUSINESS:** Fritzie offered to purchase and donate a seat like a walker to be used in the disabled women's stall. Steve Kampen made a motion to accept the motion, seconded by Dave Deterding. The motion passed unanimously.

There was discussion regarding adding personal/family mailboxes to the narthex area. This was deemed a good idea, but it will be tabled until people able to take on this project have some time.

#### HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY MAY 2024 REPORT



In May, the food pantry served 33 households which included 6 new families. There were 62 clients, 9 between the ages of 0-17; 37 between the ages of 18-59 and 16 at the age of 6() or older.

Our volunteer food pantry staff consists of Bob Hamilton, Marita Stanford, Barb

Kampen, Jan Pomeranke, Jan Clark, Eileen DeMoulpied, Pat Jones and Sue Gust. The total volunteer hours for the month of May were 85 hours. I want to thank these volunteers for their time and help with the clients. There is a lot of work involved with keeping this food pantry open on Wednesdays. The food pantry would not exist without the help of these volunteers. We appreciate the food donations from individuals in our congregation, memorials and other monetary contributions.

Our food pantry only serves Baxter Country residents. The food pantry is in need of peanut butter, cereal or jam. But any food donations are greatly appreciated. 25.78 lbs. of food was donated in May to the food pantry from our congregation.

The Love Offering for the month of July will go to the Arkansas Sheriffs' Youth Ranches. Since 1976, the Arkansas Sheriffs' Youth Ranches have provided children a place to call home. Children often come there with a history of child maltreatment. They usually lack nurturing family relationships. The different campuses provide a transformative family-style foster care prop-am. A healthy, emotionally-supportive home environment is provided for the children. At the ASYR, they help children learn to feel safe and trust others. Thus, children at the Ranch learn to cope with emotions while learning responsibility, gaining life skills, building healthy boundaries and improving self-confidence.

Our current balance of the HCLCFP checking account with First Security Bank as of 05/31/24 is \$3,650.94. The expenses were \$548.04 with O deposits.

#### **STEWARDSHIP**

#### The Apostle Lazarus

When we hear the word "apostle", we most often think of the twelve disciples of Jesus who were commissioned to spread his teachings after the ascension. The definition of apostle is: one sent to preach the Gospel. By this definition, Lazarus was a true apostle.

From many Bible texts, we know Lazarus as the brother of Mary and Martha of Bethany and has the one whom Jesus raised from the dead. Jesus was a regular visitor to their home. They were beloved by Jesus. After all, Jesus wept when he had heard of the death of his good friend. (See the various verses in the Gospel of John and Luke.)

In his second life, Lazarus became an apostle. His travels took him to the island of Cyprus and to the port town of Marseilles in France. Cyprus is in the Mediterranean Sea and Marseilles is on the southern edge of France on the Mediterranean Sea. It is a doable journey either way.

Just as the Jewish leaders had plotted against Jesus, they too plotted against Lazarus and his family. Lazarus and his sisters eventually fled to the island of Cyprus to its principal town of Citium. There is strong evidence of Lazarus founding churches in Cyprus and ministering there for many years. His tomb was in Citium; however, his bones were removed to Constantinople as were many of the other apostles.

The evidence of Lazarus's presence in Marseilles is also very compelling. The first church that Lazarus built in Marseilles has now been built into a cathedral, now called St. Victors. There are ancient religious texts, monuments and relics that show that Lazarus had a substantial following in France. He nurtured the church in Marseilles for about seven years before returning to Cyprus.



#### Carol's Applesauce Cake

2 1/4 cup flour

1 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. baking powder

3/4 tsp. salt

2 tsp. cinnamon

1 tsp. ginger

1/2 tsp. nutmeg

1/4 tsp. allspice

3/4 cup sugar

1/2 cup brown sugar

2 large eggs

2 cups applesauce

3/4 cup vegetable or canola oil

1 tsp. vanilla

#### **Cream Cheese Frosting**

8 oz. cream cheese (softened)

6 tbs. vanilla

3 cups confectionary sugar

1 tsp. vanilla



#### Cake

- Whisk cake dry ingredients for 30 seconds and set aside.
- Cream sugars and eggs 2 min.
- Add remaining liquids (applesauce, oil, vanilla) to sugar mixture until combined
- Combine wet and dry ingredients till flour is mixed in well
- Pour into 9x13 sprayed baking pan and tap to level batter
- Bake 30-40 min. till toothpick in center comes out free of batter

#### **Frosting**

Beat cream cheese, butter, confectioners sugar and vanilla at low speed until combined. Increase speed to high and whip for several minutes till light and fluffy. Spread over cooled cake. Store in fridge.
