

HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: July 11, 2024 9:30 AM

Holy Cross Lutheran Church's mission is to reach out to all people with the Gospel of Christ:

ROLL CALL: Pastor Sherman Gordius, David Deterding, Dave Hahn, Judy Hoover, Steve Kampen,

Charles Polacek, Kathy Scott, Lisa Streu, Carol Wheeler, Rod Zuck.

Excused Absence: Kathy Owen

Absent: Frank Fusco Observers: None

DEVOTIONS: Dave Deterding gave devotions discussing unexpected abundance. These unexpected abundances were received by us when we accepted Jesus' offer of forgiveness through his sacrifice and can lead us back to God. We should use them to give praise to our God who gave them to us originally. Frank Fusco is scheduled for August devotions.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Steve Kampen, financial secretary, gave the giving report. Overall giving was down in June despite 5 Sundays. Summer giving tends to decrease as people go on vacation.

Charles Polacek gave the financial summary. Giving was down and there were a few extra expenses this month, i.e. quarterly property insurance. Despite this, overall, the year to date was better than the budgeted numbers. There has also been an increase in the Endowment and Mission Plus accounts over the last 6 months. The CD term ends July 31 (12-month).

Rod Zuck made a motion to accept the financial reports; seconded by Dave Hahn. The motion was approved.

MINUTES: Minutes from both the regular council meeting from June 13, 2024, and the special council meeting from June 16, 2024, were presented. A motion was made by Steve Kampen; seconded by Dave Hahn to accept both sets of minutes. The motion was approved.

PASTOR'S REPORT: The lay ministry team meeting went well. New materials for training the team have been ordered.

Pastor found an old gift card marked for the food pantry when cleaning his desk; this will be passed to food pantry personnel to use.

August 20th MD appointment for pastor will give better direction on his health. He also has family coming soon so he will be spending time with them but will be available as needed.

VISIONING: A legacy has been left to HCLC. Several stipulations regarding the use of the money have been verbalized to the council. Kathy Scott will be getting the information regarding this legacy in written form to confirm all the stipulations so they can be followed. Kathy, Judy Hoover, and Charles Polacek will be meeting later this month with the person distributing the funds to determine options for how to handle the money. They will get back to the council at the special council meeting on June 28 regarding the church's options.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Banners have been purchased and received. The cost was slightly more than quoted in the previous special council minutes, as they have grommets for hanging and are made of wind resistant mesh to prevent tearing. The property committee will put in a permanent base to hang them.

The tentative date for the closing on the small piece of property being sold to the neighbor is July 18, 2024. No new news has been received regarding the closing.

Cottage meetings will be tabled indefinitely as a good way for the new pastor to get to know the members per an approved motion by Rod Zuck which was seconded by Kathy Scott. This passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS: No new business

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

CALL COMMITTEE: There was a request from the bishop's office for the committee to revise the Site Profile. This will be addressed in an August meeting.

EDUCATION: Written report. Bible study is being held less during the summer due to vacations.

EVANGELISM: No report.

FINANCE: Written and oral reports given.

PROPERTY: Banner information as previously discussed. The sign company addressed one of the outstanding issues. They are still addressing several additional issues. The damage to the trees and fascia from the storms has been rectified. Insurance is still pending regarding land-scaping from the accident that damaged the sign.

SOCIAL MINISTRY: Nothing to report.

STEWARDSHIP: Articles are still being printed in the newsletter. Last month was on Lazarus' work. A survey regarding stewardship was handed out and will be reviewed at the next meeting.

. **WORSHIP AND MUSIC:** Nothing to report. Dan, Rod, and Cleo are going to CBL to have a Taizé service.

COUNCIL MEETINGS ARE HELD ON THE SECOND THURSDAY

OF EVERY MONTH AT 9:30 AM

SPECIAL JOINT COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES CHRIST BY THE LAKE LUTHERAN CHURCH AND HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH BULL SHOALS AND MOUNTAIN HOME, AR MINUTES FOR HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH JULY 15. 2024

The meeting was called to order at 3 pm by Pastor Sherman Gordius. Attendees were Pastor Sherman and the members of Christ by the Lake and Holy Cross Lutheran Church councils. Pastor Sherman led with a prayer.

Pastor Sherman has submitted his official resignation to Bishop Becca. He provided a copy of his letter of resignation to the council and a draft of the informational letter for the congregations to each council member. The letter to the congregations will be sent out shortly to everyone in the congregations.

He is working on his synod-based retirement paperwork as well as paperwork related to his pension and medical plan. When the synod receives and approves their paperwork, an official notice will be sent to the church council presidents.

In anticipation of his retirement, he is cleaning his offices and has materials that are related to evangelism, stewardship, etc., that he is offering to members. He is also donating his mini fridges from his offices to the respective churches. He will also make visits to shut-ins to ensure they understand there will be members of the church that will continue to visit and can offer Holy Communion.

His intended last Sunday will be Sunday, August 18, 2024, for Christ by the Lake, and Sunday, August 11 or 18, 2024 (TBD), for Holy Cross. His last day will be August 31, 2024, with a retirement date of September 1, 2024.

The council members from Christ by the Lake made a motion to accept Pastor Sherman's resignation as presented in his July 15, 2024, letter to the council and then seconded it and then approved it unanimously.

Dave Deterding from Holy Cross Lutheran Church made a motion to accept Pastor Sherman's resignation as presented in his July 15, 2024, letter to the council; seconded by Dave Hahn. The motion was approved unanimously.

A suggestion was made that HCLC members consider taking classes as CBL members are doing help the lay teams improve preaching and leading worship.

Pastor Sherman offered a closing prayer.

Marilyn Pool made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Bob Smith. This was approved unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 3:37 pm.

HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: JULY 14, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 9:55 am.

ROLL CALL: David Deterding, Frank Fusco, Dave Hahn, Judy Hoover, Steve Kampen, Kathy Owen,

Charles Polacek, Kathy Scott, Lisa Streu, Carol Wheeler Excused Absence: Pastor Sherman Gordius, and Rod Zuck

OLD BUSINESS: Judy Hoover received information from the abstract company handling the closing on the piece of land being sold to John Eberhard. They need 1) A document stating who can sign on behalf of the church and 2) a resolution authorizing the sale of the specific property by all listed in the first document. These requirements will be satisfied by 1) a copy of the church constitution that states the current church council president has the authority to sign all documentation related to the church and these special council meeting minutes stating the current council president and 2) the April 11, 2024, council meeting minutes where the council discussed the proposal to sell the land, made appropriate motions, and voted to approve the proposal.

Charles Polacek made a motion to authorize church council president, Judy Hoover, to sign the closing papers on the 22-foot, 50-foot parcel (1100 sq. ft.) adjacent to John Eberhard's property. The sale was approved at the April 11, 2024, Holy Cross Lutheran Church council meeting. The motion was seconded by Steve Kampen. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 10:05 am.

HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: JULY 28, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am.

ROLL CALL: David Deterding, Frank Fusco, Dave Hahn, Judy Hoover, Steve Kampen, Kathy Owen,

Kathy Scott, Lisa Streu, Carol Wheeler, and Rod Zuck

Excused Absence: Pastor Sherman Gordius, and Charles Polacek

OLD BUSINESS: Kathy Scott presented the information given to her, along with Charles Polacek and Judy Hoover by Thrivent financial advisor, Shawn Taylor on Tuesday, July 23, 2024, regarding the legacy left to Holy Cross Lutheran Church by Ken Apel. Shawn indicated that there was no written information in the will regarding restrictions on the use of the money by the church. That said, both Shawn and Ken's son, Paul, have verbally relayed his wishes regarding distribution of the money by HCLC. His main intentions were to provide money to help obtain a new pastor and grow the congregation.

Both HCLC and Ken's grandchildren were originally listed as beneficiaries of both his IRA and mutuals. The family was able to remove the grandchildren from the IRA, so that HCLC is the sole beneficiary of this amount which will be tax free. They were attempting to remove HCLC from the mutuals so that the entire amount of them would be divided among the grandchildren. This was not accomplished at the time of his death. They have asked that HCLC refund the money from the mutuals to Ken's grandchildren, as HCLC will receive the IRA.

Dave Hahn made a motion to refund the mutuals money back to Ken's grandchildren. The motion was seconded by Steve Kampen. The motion passed unanimously. The money will be placed in general fund/Mission Plus until further discussion about its disposition can occur at a general council meeting. The meeting adjourned at 10:10 am.

HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY JULY 2024 REPORT



In July, the food pantry served 31 households which included six new households. There were 75 clients, 19 between the ages of 0-17; 40 between the ages of 18-59 and 16 at the age of 60 or older.

Our volunteer staff worked a total of 81 hours during the month of July. Our food pantry volunteer staff consists of Barb Kampen, Bob Hamilton, Marita Stanford, Jan Pomeranke, Jan Clark, Pat Jones, Eileen DeMoulpied and Sue Gust. I want to thank our volunteers for their time and effort helping with the food pantry so that we can serve families in need of food assistance here in Baxter County.

For the month of July, our food pantry received 217 lbs. of food donated from the Food Basket and 167.83 lbs. of food from the congregation. We appreciated the home grown cucumbers from Rod & Lori Zuck. All donated food and money are greatly appreciated so that our food pantry can continue to serve these families.

We are in need of cereal or saltine crackers that come in sleeves in a box for the food pantry. If you would like to donate these items or other food items, you can place these items in the Narthex on the black shelves of the small storage unit to the right of the carved entrance door to the church sanctuary.

The Love Offering for the month of September will go to the Holy Cross Lutheran Church Food Pantry. We are in need of monetary funds. It will be greatly appreciated. We haven't had a fund raiser in seven years and our funds are running low. We may have to have a find raiser in order to keep our food pantry open but it's difficult getting volunteers to help out.

The statement for the HCLCFP checking account with First Security Bank did not come in to include in this monthly report and will be added in next month's report.

Apostle and Gospel Writer St. Mark

It was long held theory that the Gospel of Mark was written about 68 to 70 A.D. However, it is now possible that this Gospel was written in 50 A.D., just 17 years after the death of Jesus. Nineteen small pieces of papyrus found within the Dead Sea Scrolls seem to be the earliest known copy of the Gospel of Mark. This means that there were many believers alive at that time who knew Jesus. Mark's Gospel at that time would have had to undergo much scrutiny by those who knew Jesus and his teachings. The Gospel survived and has stood the test of time.

But exactly who was this person that we have come to know as St. Mark? Mark's name appears in several New Testament books: Acts, I Peter, and II Timothy. At first he is described as John, also known as Mark. But as time went by he was known only as Mark.

Mark and his mother, Mary, lived in Jerusalem and were some of the early believers in Christ. It is thought that Peter converted Mark and his mother and they had a close relationship. In I Peter, Peter refers to Mark as his son. Mark was also a cousin to Barnabas. Mark accompanied Barnabas and Paul on Paul's first missionary journey. It was Silas who went with Paul on his second missionary journey while Mark and Barnabas retraced the steps of the first journey.

Mark became a missionary in his own right. He traveled to what is now Turkey. He went on to Cyprus and established churches in Egypt at Alexandria. The Coptic Church in Egypt has very detailed accounts and traditions regarding Mark.

In Peter's last imprisonment in Rome, he asked for Mark. Mark is described as a disciple and interpreter of Peter. At the urging of the Christians at Rome, it is believed that Mark wrote his Gospel at this time from the lessons and stories that he learned from Peter.

Mark, like the other apostles, was an evangelist and educator. In the return trips that he did to the churches that he first established, Mark again was the evangelist and educator. This continued support for the new churches was vital. The concept of stewardship comes in from the support and help in maintaining the new churches.


