HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: November 14, 2024

9:30 AM

Holy Cross Lutheran Church's mission is to reach out to all people with the Gospel of Christ:

- By worship
- By proclaiming God's saving grace, and
- By serving human needs, so that all may live together in peace and the love of Christ.

DEVOTIONS: Devotions were given by Lisa Streu based on 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18. In these verses, Paul encourages all of us to rejoice, pray, and give thanks in all circumstances, even if things don't seem to be going our way. At this time of Thanksgiving in our country, we should remember all the things God has given us, even if they are not what was requested. God knows what is best for all.

SPECIAL CALL COMMITTEE REPORT: The members of the call committee, Sue Hahn, Wanda Soutter, and Lori Zuck, attended the meeting to present the status of the committee. Lori Zuck informed council that Bishop Becca requested that parts of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) be reworded as they were too generic. She requested that more specific details be worked into the MSP to catch possible candidates' attention. The MSP will also need to be resubmitted in February 2025 (an MSP is only valid for one year). They have reworked some of the wording and presented it to the council, but other suggestions were made that will be added/revised and then a finalized version will need council approval, prior to resubmission. These changes will hopefully make the church seem more attractive and easier to find with electronic search functions on the portal site.

An additional point was made by the call committee that advertising by an individual church is not allowed. It must be sent to the ELCA nationwide portal site through the Synod. Word of mouth is the only way advertising is allowed per the ELCA by individual congregations. Per the Bishop, there isn't much interest in the AR-OK Synod specifically on the portal site, but there is a fair amount of interest in lay ministry personnel help for pastors and in part time work.

An idea for a possible contractual sign-on bonus (monetary grant, property loan/down payment help with forgiveness, etc.) was discussed. This is not forbidden by the Synod or ELCA, so it is an option. Christ by the Lake would have to agree with this idea and any suggestions would be brought to the congregation for approval. Further information will be forthcoming on this idea when details are solidified. This will not be in the initial portal advertising but can be brought up during the financial package discussion during the interview process.

Other discussions occurred on which parish would be offering any call and doing the hiring (primary church). Right now, CBL is the designated primary church... possibly a holdover from Pastor Sherman's situation. Further negotiation and clarification will occur on this point.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Kathy Scott and Charles Polacek will be covering Steve Kampen's financial secretary duties for the present while Steve is recuperating. Kathy presented the giving report and stated that giving is slightly decreased but in line with the YTD budget.

Charles Polacek, church treasurer, presented the financial statements. The checking account is at a point that another \$10,000 can be pulled from that account and placed in the Mission Plus interest bearing account. A check that was sent to Ken Apel's grandchild to pay what was owed from the settlement was not cashed. That check was voided, and another check was cut and sent. We continue with neither interim nor called pastor expenses. Other expenses are in line with the budget taking into consideration the exceptions noted in previous months, i.e. insurance premium increases, etc. Overall financials are in line with the budget.

A decision was also made to open another Thrivent account to have an interest-bearing account for excess general funds. Kathy Scott made a motion to take the excess \$10,000 out of the checking account and open a new Mission Plus checking account for general fund use. Dave Hahn seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously.

Discussion occurred regarding naming or adding comments in the financial software to specify what each fund is and its uses. Charles Polacek will look into what can be done to differentiate the accounts.

MINUTES: The minutes from the October 10, 2024, council meeting were reviewed. Charles Polacek made a motion to accept the minutes; seconded by Kathy Scott. Motion was approved.

VISIONING: Nothing new was presented.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The siding request for no more than \$12,000 will be taken a special congregational meeting as soon as possible.

Follow-up will be made with the Synod regarding having the Synod offset some of the Synod Council meeting costs.

The Franke estate is in probate and will hopefully soon allow the administrator to liquidate the assets. The HCLC Food Pantry will receive half the assets when probate is finalized.

NEW BUSINESS: Christmas Eve candlelight service will be at 6 pm on Tuesday, December 24, 2024, and presided over by Pastor Mike Clark. Addendum: This is being clarified.

Motion made to accept Committee reports by Rod Zuck and seconded by Charles Polacek. Motion carried unanimously. Motion to adjourn made by Lisa Streu and seconded by Dave Hahn. Motion carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 11 am. The next council meeting will be Thursday, December 12, 2024, at 9:30 am. All prayed the Lord's Prayer together.



HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY NOVEMBER 2024 REPORT



In November, the food pantry served 41 households which included 8 new households. There were 97 clients, 27 between the ages of 0-17; 49 between the ages of 18-59; and 21 at the age of 60 or older. Six clients were veterans.

Our volunteer staff worked a total of 70.25 hours during the month of November. Our food pantry volunteer staff consists of Barb Kampen, Marita Stanford, Bob Hamilton, Jan Clark, Jan Pomeranke, Pat Jones and Sue Gust. I want to thank our volunteers for their time and effort helping to assist the families that come to our pantry and inputting client information in Oasis which is a site required by the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas. There is a lot more work involved with the food pantry such as the inventory, buying the food, transporting the food bought back to the food pantry, stocking the shelves and required monthly reports.

For the month of November and December, Holy Cross Lutheran Church Food Pantry would like to thank- the Thrivent Financial Action Team for the two-\$250 Visa cards. The \$250 Visa cards were used to purchase the boneless turkey breasts which each family received, one during the month of November and for December; a ham was given to each family.

The Love Offering for the month of January will go to the Ozark Center of Hope of Mountain Home. Ozark Center of Hope helps poverty level income families in crisis situations by helping with utility assistance, housing assistance, personal care items and spiritual counseling.

On November 1, at the location of the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas, the North Central Board of Realtors had their annual food distribution which was given to the food pantries serving Baxter and Marion counties. Our food pantry received 285 lbs. of non-perishable food on that day which certainly will help our food pantry. Our food pantry received 20.28 lbs. of donated bakery goods from Harp's and 13.61 lbs. of donated non-perishable goods from individuals during the month of November.

The balance as of 11/29/24 in the HCLCFP checking account with First Security Bank was \$2,949.69. Expenses were \$1,352.60 and deposits of \$1,505.00.


