HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: December 12, 2024 9:30 AM

DEVOTIONS: Devotions read by Carol Wheeler. They were from <u>Our Daily Bread</u> and were based on Luke 2. The biblical account of Jesus' birth states that there was no room available for the Holy Family in Bethlehem due to the census. Later, Jesus found a borrowed room for to celebrate the Last Supper with His followers illustrating that Jesus is with is always. The devotions ask us to always make room for Jesus in our lives and no matter where we are, Jesus will always be with us.

Steve Kampen will do January devotions and Kathy Owen will do February devotions.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Steve Kampen, financial secretary, gave the giving report. The numbers were in line with the budget and average giving. Charles Polacek, church treasurer, gave the treasurers' report. We have used the excess money from the Mission Plus building fund for approved projects, and the rest will be renamed the Mission Plus General Fund starting in January 2025. Another \$15,000 was moved from the checking account to the Mission Plus fund (interest bearing) and a working amount is left in the checking account. Expenses were in line with the budget. David Deterding made a motion; seconded by Steve Kampen to approve the financial reports. The motion passed.

MINUTES: There were 3 sets of minutes: The regular council meeting on November 14, 2024, the annual meeting minutes on November 10, 2024, and a special congregational meeting on December 1, 2024. Dave Hahn made a motion to accept all three sets of minutes; seconded by Kathy Owen. The motion passed.

VISIONING: The banner will be changed to the Christmas one this week.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Nothing.

NEW BUSINESS: The council received a letter from Jeff and Jan Pomeranke requesting their membership transfer to Christian Church of Mountain Home.

Discussion of having a service of Word and song for the 5th Sunday in December. Carol will discuss with Dan.

There is an invitation from the Presbyterian Church of Bull Shoals to attend their Christmas Eve service at noon followed by a fellowship time. This is an open invitation.

The list of 2025 Love offering recipients was given to the council.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

CALL COMMITTEE: The bishop requested a few further changes in the MSP, i.e. financials which dated from 2022, etc. This will be taken care of by the call committee. Further options to have backup for conducting services were discussed and any action will be tabled until 2025.

EDUCATION: No report **EVANGELISM:** No report

FINANCE: Written and oral reports given.

PROPERTY: Landscaping is progressing. The siding bid from Marchant's was accepted and should be started soon. The sealing of the windows will be done as well, but no start date is available.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Service at 6 pm at HCLC with communion on Christmas Eve. Pastor Mike

will be presiding.

Motion made to accept Committee reports by Steve Kampen and seconded by Dave Hahn. Motion carried unanimously. Motion to adjourn made by Charles Polacek and seconded by Steve Kampen. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 10:20 am.

HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY DECEMBER 2024 REPORT



In December, the food pantry served 33 households which included 6 new households. There were 73 clients, 23 between the ages of 0-17; 32 between the ages of 18-59; and 18 at the age of 60 or older. Three clients were veterans.

Our volunteer staff worked a total of 68.75 hours during the month of December. Our food pantry volunteer staff consists of Barb Kampen, Marita Stanford, Bob Hamilton, Jan Clark, Jan Pomeranke, Pat Jones and Sue Gust. I want to thank our volunteers for their time and effort helping to assist families that come to our food pantry and inputting client information in Oasis, which is a site required by the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas.

Donated Harp's baked goods have been given to us from Dennis Baker who lives in Jordan, AR. He picks up Harp's donated baked goods to deliver to the food pantry in Norfork, AR and extra baked goods he calls Barb Kampen to pick up in Jordan, AR, which happens every couple of weeks. For the month of December, we received 47.39 lbs. of Harp's donated baked goods and 47.03 lbs. of donated goods from individuals.

The Love Offering for the month of February will go to the pastor discretionary fund.

The balance as of 12/31/24 in the HCLCFP checking account with First Security Bank was \$5,128.80. Expenses were \$603.74 and deposits were \$2,782.85. The remaining amount of the Holy Cross Lutheran Church Food Pantry- CD at the Bank OZK-\$2757.85 due for renewal on 12/16/24 was closed out and deposited in the HCLCFP account with First Security Bank.


