HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: January 9, 2025 9:30 AM

Holy Cross Lutheran Church's mission is to reach out to all people with the Gospel of Christ:

DEVOTIONS: Steve read various passages from the Bible regarding the direction our paths should be directed. This includes not only just listening to His Word but obeying it to achieve God's will. The passages included verses from Psalms 16 and 25 and James Chapter 1.

SPECIAL CALL COMMITTEE REPORT: Lori Zuck presented an update and request for approval on changes to the Ministry Site Profile, as requested by Bishop Becca. These included more details on the demographics of the community and our partnership with CBLC. There will be a further update in February for resubmission of the MSP to the Synod for the next year. A motion was made by Charles Polacek, seconded by Steve Kampen to accept the changes to the MSP and allow for its' submission to the Synod. The motion was approved. Discussion occurred regarding who can give Communion to shut-ins and hospitalized patients. We will be discussing further pulpit supply options following the bishop's visit in February. It was decided to place a sheet on the bulletin board in the office to track those who need contacts, visitations, Communion, etc. Anyone can add to this sheet or call the office and let Keisha know to add someone to the list. Kathy Owen will follow this list and make those who make the visitations aware of any needs.

OFFICER ELECTIONS: No new nominations were made for any officer position. All officers agreed to serve in their current positions for another year. The current slate of officers was presented to the council. Charles Polacek made a motion to accept the slate of officers, seconded by Kathy Owen. The motion was approved. HCLC council officers for 2025 will be: President: Judy Hoover; Vice President: Dave Hahn; Secretary: Lisa Streu.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Steve Kampen, financial secretary, gave the giving report. Giving is relatively in line with the budget. Charles Polacek, church treasurer, presented the financial statements. He has updated the fixed asset amounts based on actual replacement costs of the property per the insurance policy. The Mission Plus account has two separate amounts within it for now. The first is the part for property improvement/maintenance and will be used up to finish paying for the improvements approved at the recent congregational meeting. At that time the rest of the fund (~\$30,000) will be renamed as Mission Plus General Fund and consist of an earlier non-designated bequest from a member. Another \$1,000 from the Ken Apel estate was sent to the church and placed in the Thrivent account dedicated to his bequest. The financial statements from banks/financial

institutions were late this month, so the balances are not completely current. Expenses remain in line except for a few exceptions from the last year: Office equipment was a new computer purchase, software licenses increased in cost, as did insurance, HVAC maintenance, the water expense went up due to a leak, and several other minor costs above budget. He also presented the finalized contributions breakdown for the church. Overall giving (regular weekly offerings only) was down about 9% with a stable number of family units, but we are still financially stable at this time. Dave Hahn made a motion to accept all the financial reports, seconded by Kathy Owen. The motion passed unanimously.

MINUTES: Minutes were reviewed from the December 12, 2024, meeting. A motion was made to approve the minutes by Kathy Owen; seconded by Steve Kampen to approve the minutes. The motion was approved.

VISIONING: Nothing presented.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: A packet of materials regarding the Gerald Franke estate, which is now in probate, was presented to Judy Hoover. She will sign those papers that require her signature and deliver them to the person in charge of probate.

NEW BUSINESS: Bishop Becca will be coming for a meeting with the CBLC and HCLC call committees, councils, and other interested congregation members on February 22, 2025. It will be at CBLC at approximately 4 pm with a potluck meal. The reason for the meeting is to discuss the SAM program (Synodically Authorized Ministry) to help with more thorough coverage for our churches while we are without a called pastor. Bishop Becca will then preach on Sunday at both HCLC and CBLC.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Christmas decorations are down. Next season to plan for is Lent.

FOOD PANTRY: Written report. **MEN'S GROUP:** No report.

Motion made to accept Committee reports by Steve Kampen and seconded by Dave Hahn. Motion carried unanimously. Motion to adjourn made by Steve Kampen and seconded by Rod Zuck. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 10:20 am.

The next council meeting will be Thursday, February 13, 2025, at 9:30 am.

HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY JANUARY 2025 REPORT



In January, the food pantry served 17 households, which included one new household. There were 35 clients, 6 between the ages of 0-17; 19 between the ages of 18-59 and 10 at the age of 60 or older.

Our volunteer staff worked a total of 42.25 hours during the month of January. Our food pantry volunteer staff consists of Barb Kampen, Bob Hamilton, Marita Stanford, Jan Pomeranke, Jan Clark, and Sue Gust. I want to thank our volunteers for their time and effort helping with the food pantry so we can serve families in need of food assistance here in Baxter County.

Effective January 2025, our food pantry will be open on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month. Our hours of operation to give food assistance to families in need will remain the same, opening from 9 A.M. to 11 A.m. and 1 P.M. to 3 P.M.

For the month of January, our food pantry received 64.97 lbs. of food donated from Harp's grocery store and 28.39 lbs. of food from individuals. All donated food and money are greatly appreciated so that our food pantry can continue to serve these families.

The Love Offering for the month of March will go to Care Center Ministries of Mountain Home. Care Center Ministries is a 501c3 organization and is completely privately funded. They offer a transformative one-year faith-based discipleship program dedicated to liberating men and women from the grips of addiction and life-controlling issues. The comprehensive one-year program is free to residents and is licensed by the Arkansas Community Corrections. Care Center Ministries offers the following services: lawn maintenance, general labor, cleaning services, waste & junk removal and moving.

Our current balance of the HCLCFP checking account with First Security Bank as of 01/31/25 is \$4,701.80. The expenses were \$537.00 with \$110.00 deposits.




