HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: March 13, 2025 9:30 AM

Holy Cross Lutheran Church's mission is to reach out to all people with the Gospel of Christ:

- By worship
- By proclaiming God's saving grace, and
- By serving human needs, so that all may live together in peace and the love of Christ.

DEVOTIONS: Judy Hoover gave devotions from *Our Daily Bread*. The reading was from Ezekial 11:19. We can find a new heart in Christ by turning to God with prayer, faith, and repentance. With changed hearts we can follow Him faithfully. He longs for this.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Steve Kampen, financial secretary, gave the giving report for February. Giving is slightly above YTD giving.

Charles Polacek, church treasurer, gave the treasurer's report. Expenses were slightly above budget in a few areas, the most significant amount in pulpit supply. Synod raised the salary guidelines to \$180 per service so this will affect our expenditures. As we aren't paying for a pastor, this will not be an issue. Dave Hahn made a motion; seconded by Steve Kampen to approve the financial reports. The motion was approved.

MINUTES: The minutes from February 13, 2025, were reviewed. One correction was made. We cannot have Maundy Thursday service at 5 pm, as CBL is having its service then (Pastor Peter Olson performing both). Dave Hahn made a motion; seconded by Kathy Owen to approve the corrected minutes. The motion was approved.

VISIONING: Nothing new currently.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: SAM update. Sue Hahn has been approved to be a SAM for HCLC; she will be considered the worship leader for HCLC. CBL has 4 SAM personnel currently. The bishop has given her consent to all of them to perform the Sacraments and perform funerals if needed at both CBL and HCLC. They will work together to get a schedule starting April 1, 2025, to make sure one SAM covers each church every week, unless other accommodations have been made. Pastor Mike Clark will continue to preside at the second Sunday service at HCLC. He has also offered his services to help train lay people to perform hospital and home visits and give Holy Communion for those unable to attend church. He has not heard if CBL wants him to continue performing the service there on the fourth Sunday of each month. We will continue to need an ALM for each service. Please consider volunteering or accepting if invited to help. Sue will be a liaison to the council for the SAM program to ensure communication.

There will be Communion every Sunday plus festivals, starting April 1, 2025, at HCLC.

Holy Week schedule, with Pastor Peter Olson presiding, will be as follows: Maundy Thursday at 1 pm, Good Friday at 1 pm, and Easter Sunday at 9:00 am. CBL will have Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and an Easter Vigil on Saturday of Holy Week; all will be held at 5 pm. HCLC members are invited to attend. We will post these times in the bulletins and the newsletter to keep everyone informed. Sue will contact Pastor Peter regarding types of services and when Communion will be served and pass this information to the office and Carol Wheeler.

A regular service will be performed on the fifth Sunday in March.

NEW BUSINESS: Rod Zuck has chosen to resign from the Church council.

Almayrene Reinthaler continues to live with her daughter in Wisconsin while recuperating. She appreciates all contact from members of HCLC. She wishes to continue her membership here and requested some offering envelopes and will have Communion in Wisconsin to allow her membership to remain active.

Easter brunch plans are being made. The menu will be egg casserole, biscuits and gravy, fruit, juices, coffee, and sweet breads/muffins. There will be sign-up sheets for attendance and donations of the breads/muffins as we get closet to Easter. This will be in the newsletter.

The deacon team is being organized with Kathy Owen in charge. She has been contacting members to make calls to those unable to attend services to check on them and see if they have any needs, i.e. Communion, visits, etc. This information will be relayed to Kathy, and she will contact our outreach lay people to help keep these people involved in our church. Several people have accepted but please consider offering your time to help others.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

CALL COMMITTEE: The changes to the Site Ministry Profile that were approved in January were submitted to Synod. Approval was received on 2/26/25. This will take the place of the normal yearly resubmission which was due in February 2025; next submission is due in February 2026.

EDUCATION: Kathy Owen will take over the education committee.

EVANGELISM: A flyer will be placed in quilting shops, etc. regarding our Monday morning workshop to advertise our church. Kathy Owen had talked to another customer in Hobby Lobby who expressed interest in being involved in a small quilting group and this idea came from that interaction.

FINANCE: Written and oral reports given.

PROPERTY: The work is done on the building. Mowing should start soon.

SOCIAL MINISTRY: Nothing to report. **STEWARDSHIP:** Nothing to report.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Nothing to report in addition to that discussed in New Business.

FOOD PANTRY: Written report.

MEN'S GROUP: Meeting will be held Saturday, March 15. Spaghetti supper planned for April 12, from 4-6 pm. A proposal was made that the men's group host one Sunday fellowship each month or two to help cover some dates. This will be taken to the meeting.

Motion made to accept Committee reports by Steve Kampen and seconded by Charles Polacek. Motion carried unanimously. Motion to adjourn made by Steve Kampen and seconded by Kathy Owen. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 10:35 am

HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY MONTHLY REPORT-MARCH 2025

In March, the food pantry served 13 households, which included two new households. There were 28 clients, 8 between the ages of 0-17; 13 between the ages of 18-59 and 7 at the age of 60 or older.

Our volunteer staff worked a total of 32 hours during the month of March. Our food pantry volunteer staff consists of Barb Kampen, Bob Hamilton, Marita Stanford, Jan Clark, Jan Pomeranke and Sue Gust. I want to thank our volunteers for their time and effort helping with the food pantry so we can serve families in need of food assistance here in Baxter County.

For the month of March, our food pantry received 35.44 lbs. of baked goods from Harp's grocery store and 4.5 lbs. of donated food from individuals. All donated food and money are greatly appreciated so that our food pantry can continue to serve these families in need of food.

If anyone would like to donate cereal or saltine crackers- (we prefer the saltine crackers that come in sleeves which we give one sleeve to each family).

The Love Offering for the month of May will go to the Twin Lakes Shrine Club, a 501c3 non-profit organization located here in Mountain Home, AR. Frank Fusco, who is a member of the Twin Lakes Shrine Club, says the monetary support through this Love Offering helps transport children to the Shrine hospital in St. Louis, MO. Twin Lakes Shrine Club provides transportation at no cost to the families for the children that have appointments at the hospital. This Twin Lakes Shrine Club has been in existence for about 50 years.

Our credit balance with the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas is at \$655.48. The current balance of the HCLCFP checking account with the First Security Bank is \$4,156.79 as of 03/31/25. The expenses were \$334.61 and deposits of \$5.00.


