HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: April 10, 2025 9:30 AM

DEVOTIONS: Kathy Scott gave the devotions from Psalm 121, which is a psalm of assurance, and a reading from *The Word in Season*. FINANCIAL REPORTS:

Steve Kampen, financial secretary, gave the giving report for March which is above the average. Charles Polacek, church treasurer, gave the treasurer's report. The Mission Plus Building account has been spent so only a general fund Mission Plus will now be available. ECLA Fund quarterly report will come in April. First quarter insurance payment was the largest expense this month. Other expenses are in line, so the budget is good currently. Special reports for Mission Plus, Food Pantry, and Handbell funds were reported. Dave Hahn made a motion to accept the financial reports; seconded by Steve Kampen. The motion was approved.

MINUTES: The minutes of the March 13, 2025, meeting had a typo. A motion was made to approve the corrected minutes by Steve Kampen; seconded by Charles Polacek. The motion was approved.

VISIONING: Nothing

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Question was raised if Rod Zuck needed to be replaced by the council. His term runs out as of December 31, 2025, so his spot will be left open until the end of year.

NEW BUSINESS: A discussion of payment for the SAMs was held. First a clarification will occur with the bishop. Suggestion from CBL was for \$100 plus mileage for each service. Sue Hahn is refusing payment, but others may wish to be paid if acceptable with the Synod. If payment is acceptable with the bishop, Dave Hahn made a motion to approve this to make sure we have continuity with the SAMs. The motion was seconded by Charles Polacek. The motion was approved. Judy Hoover will check with the bishop and have a discussion regarding the amounts with Linda Masters from CBL. This is contingent on receiving a W-9 form from each one. Tim will get paid for his two services in March.

Frank Fusco is in the Lake Forest Senior Living skilled nursing facility, in room 106. He would appreciate visitors.

Mike Clark will continue serving on the second Sunday of each month at HCLC and the 4th Sunday of each month at CBL.

Food pantry received first check from the Gerald Franke estate. Another check will be coming when the estate is finalized.

CALL COMMITTEE: Nothing new currently. MSP is up to date until February 2026.

EDUCATION: Bible study is steady at 14-15 people.

EVANGELISM: There is a small committee that is checking on congregants that are unable to attend

services.

SOCIAL MINISTRY: Nothing to report. **STEWARDSHIP.** Nothing to report.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Holy Week coming up with Easter Brunch.

FOOD PANTRY: Written report.

MEN'S GROUP: Spaghetti supper is April 12. The group is having a speaker from the Center of Hope at their May 17, 2025, meeting. All members of the Men's Group and WELCA are invited to attend.

The Day of Pentecost

The third most important festival of the church year is Pentecost, which occurs 50 days after Easter. Pentecost cele-

brates the time when the Holy Spirit came to believers. It is therefore, a day when decorations and ceremonies should suggest sound and fire as symbols of the Spirit. Bright red paraments are used on the day of Pentecost. Red gladioli may be used for altar flowers, since their shape suggests tongues of fire. To emphasize the importance of this festival, the chancel may be adorned with red geraniums. They should be arranged to call attention to the altar. Following Pentecost worship services, the geraniums may be planted on the church grounds. Holy Communion is normally celebrated on this festival.

The Holy Trinity

This festival occurs on the 1st Sunday after Pentecost, and it honors the doctrine of the Trinity. Paraments are white, and white altar flowers are fitting.

Attention Parish Members: Sun., June 8th is Pentecost this year. If you would like to adorn the Altar with a geranium, please bring it to the church Fri., June 7th and altar ladies will place them in the altar area. Geraniums that are not taken after the church service will be planted on the church property. Any questions, please call Carol Wheeler at 488-5044. HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY MONTHLY REPORT APRIL 2025

In April, the food pantry served 25 households, which included 4 new households. There were 50 clients, 11 between the ages of 0-17; 22 between the ages of 18-59 and 17 at the age of 60 or older.

Our volunteer staff worked a total of 41 hours during the month of April. Those volunteer hours include shopping for the food pantry at Walmart and the Dollar Tree, travel time and stocking the shelves. We also make trips to Jordan, AR to pick up donated food from Harp's that Dennis Baker provides to our food pantry. Our food pantry volunteer staff consists of Barb Kampen, Bob Hamilton, Marita Stanford, Jan Pomeranke, Jan Clark and Sue Gust. I want to thank our volunteers for their time inputting the information in the computers, helping taking the food outside to the clients cars and stocking the shelves in the food pantry. The food pantry helps serve families in need of food, especially with the rise in cost of food. Many of the clients have limited income and we even have homeless individuals coming to our food pantry.

If anyone would like to donate cereal or saltine crackers- (We prefer the saltine crackers that come in sleeves which we give out one sleeve of crackers to each family.)

The Love Offering for the month of June will go to Informed Choices Women's Center of the Ozarks, a 501c3 non-profit organization located here in Mountain Home. They provide support for pregnant women and their families through religious, charitable and educational means. Informed Choices helps pregnant women of all ages by providing counseling, parenting classes and emotional support.

Our credit balance with the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas is \$493.85. The HCLC food pantry checking account statement with First Security was not available to include in this monthly report. It will be included in next month's report to the church council.


