HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: May 8, 2025 9:40 AM

Holy Cross Lutheran Church's mission is to reach out to all people with the Gospel of Christ:

DEVOTIONS: Steve Kampen gave devotions from Our Daily Bread for today. The devotion was taken from Ephesians. We need to be "grafted" onto the love of Jesus as our source of power to bear fruit in this world. Carol Wheeler has June devotions.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Steve Kampen, financial secretary, gave the giving report. Donations are slightly down for the month, although in line with the YTD average.

Charles Polacek, church treasurer, gave the treasurer's report. Giving is below the YTD budget. As we do not have a pastor, we are still OK with the budget, but if we would get a pastor, income must increase. We will also have a non-budgeted item (SAMs pay) to account for and then put in the budget for next year, if needed. Expenses were in line. Steve Kampen made a motion; seconded by Kathy Scott to accept the financial reports. The motion was approved.

MINUTES: The April 10, 2025, minutes were reviewed. Discussion occurred on wording of a few items. The changes suggested will be made. Steve Kampen made a motion to accept the minutes; seconded by Charles Polacek. The motion passed.

VISIONING: Kathy Scott presented an idea used in Synod churches in western Oklahoma to provide a laundry ministry for homeless/low-income community members. The service is called Laundry with Dignity. The hope is that if these people are helped, the children may have less issues with bullying, etc. in school and have a potentially better outcome, in many aspects of their lives. It would involve approaching a laundromat and providing (once a month) quarters and laundry pods plus dryer sheets for the people using the service (they do their own laundry). It has worked well and expanded in those towns in which it has been initiated. Charles Polacek made a motion to investigate this idea further (Marita Stanford and Kathy Scott will check into this); seconded by Lisa Streu. The motion passed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Judy Hoover spoke with Linda Masters from CBL. SAMs will be paid \$100 per service but no mileage. Tim Koenig has been paid for both for a few services. He asked that the mileage he was paid be taken from his next several checks (one mileage stipend he was paid per check).

NEW BUSINESS: HCLC 40th anniversary is in 2026. Ideas will be solicited to celebrate this important anniversary. Let council members know if you have any ideas. We are looking for an old report written by Gladys Lindeman which had a written history of the church from its 30th anniversary. If anyone has a copy, let Judy know.

Linda Masters suggested having a combined council "meet and greet" quarterly to talk about what each church is doing and get to know others from CBL. This may also extend to having a combined WELCA "meet and greet" in the future.

Synod Assembly Report: Kathy Scott gave the report. She and Marita attended from HCLC. She stated that it was useful and a very good assembly. The various sessions were insightful, and some offered good suggestions to further church ministry in a practical manner (see visioning report). There were many ideas churches can use to help others without expecting a reward.

A special council meeting was called to order at 9:56 am to discuss the information gathered by Kathy Scott and Marita Stanford to initiate a laundry ministry as discussed at the last council meeting. Kathy gave a short synapsis of the program in western Oklahoma.

They have found a laundromat, A+ on Commerce in Mountain Home that is willing to try a similar program. The owner, Brandon Barnes, has two laundromats in town and is willing to work with HCLC. He suggested Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday night. With council approval, Kathy and Marita will take signage/poster examples to him and confirm that this will be acceptable. The intent is to have this every third Monday of each month in the early evening, beginning in June.

A member(s) of HCLC will be there to put out quarters, laundry pods, and dryer sheets, and monitor usage of the service. There is a donor to cover the first several months of the project. The cost is estimated to be around \$200-250 per month. Discussion was had to take collections to receive quarters or other donations to keep the ministry going after the initial donation is used. The whole project will be reassessed when the donation runs out to assess actual costs, plus positives and negatives of the project.

Kathy Owen made a motion, seconded by Charles Polacek to approve moving forward with the laundry ministry at A+ laundromat starting in June 2025 using the donated money. The motion passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:07 am.

There were 6 members and 1 guest present, breakfast was Men's fellowship served at this meeting.



HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY MAY 2025 REPORT

In May, the food pantry served 18 households, which included two new households. There were 37 clients, 7 between the ages of 0-17; 17 between the ages of 18-59 and 13 at the age of 60 or older.

Our volunteer staff worked a total of 31.75 hours during the month of May. Our food pantry volunteer staff consists of Barb Kampen, Bob Hamilton, Marita Stanford, Jan Pomeranke, Jan Clark, and Sue Gust. I want to thank our volunteers for their time and effort helping with the food pantry so we can serve families in need of food assistance here in Baxter County.

All donated food and money are greatly appreciated so that our food pantry can continue to serve these families in Baxter County.

As a reminder, our food pantry will be open on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month. Our hours of operation to give food assistance to families in need will remain the same, opening from 9 A.M. to 11 A.M. and 1 P.M. to 3 P.M.

The Love Offering for the month June will go to Informed Choices of Mountain Home which provides support for pregnant women and their families through religious, charitable, and educational means. They provide counseling, parenting classes and emotional support. The Love Offering for the month of July will go to the Arkansas Sheriff Youth Ranch -Batesville. Working with at-risk children is a key component of focus at the Arkansas Sheriff's Youth Ranch. The ranch which first opened in 1976 is on 600 acres in the Batesville area. Children coming to the ranch are generally the products of abuse and neglect caused by broken homes. With kids coming to the ranch in such formative years, the ranch aims to create a safe, healthy, and permanent home for the children. While some children will stay until they're 18 or 21, often the ranch is a bridge for children from foster care to adoption.

The previous balance of the HCLCFP checking account with First Security Bank as of 04/30/25 was \$6,503.93. The expenses were \$242.86 and deposits were \$2,590.00. The current balance of the HCLCFP at First Security Bank is \$11,906.37 as of 05/30/25. The expenses were \$447.56 with deposits of \$5,850.00. Deposits for both months were from a generous memorial gift and individuals. The credit balance account the HCLCFP has with the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas is currently \$493.85. Barb Kampen attended a Food Bank of North Central Arkansas Member Agency meeting on May 13 in which our food pantry will receive \$250 credit for attending the meeting. This can only be used with purchasing food from the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas. Marita Stanford also completed a ServSafe class and received a certification which is good for five years. Since our food pantry is a member of the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas, it is required that we have at least one of our food pantry volunteers have a current ServSafe certification.


