HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DATE: 10-9-25 9:30 AM

Holy Cross Lutheran Church's mission is to reach out to all people with the Gospel of Christ:

- By worship
- By proclaiming God's saving grace, and
- By serving human needs, so that all may live together in peace and the love of Christ.

**ROLL CALL:** David Deterding, Dave Hahn, Judy Hoover, Kathy Owen, Charles Polacek, Kathy Scott, Lisa Streu, Carol Wheeler

**DEVOTIONS:** Devotions were given by Lisa Streu from the Lutheran Camping Corporation of Central Pennsylvania. The devotion spoke of the duality of leaves: the green disappears in the fall as chlorophyll production slows, and it breaks down to reveal the bright reds, yellows, and oranges that are already in the leaves. This duality of leaves is an illustration of the duality of Christians described by Martin Luther; both sinner and saint at the same time. We cannot escape the sin but are continuously made clean and whole by God. God's love brings balance to His creation.

Steve Kampen has November devotions; Carol agreed to be alternate for him.

**FINANCIAL REPORTS:** Charles Polacek, church treasurer, presented the giving report. September was slow and below the yearly average. He then presented the financial reports. The last installment from the insurance for the roof has been received. Expenses have been in line and despite lower income the overall financial picture is acceptable, as we do not have expenses for a regular pastor. The building fund shows we spent more than we took in on income, but the repairs were necessary for the overall maintenance of the church building and grounds. All insurance checks have been received unless gutter repair is needed. Dave Hahn made a motion to approve the financial reports; seconded by Dave Deterding. The motion carried.

**MINUTES:** The minutes of September 11, 2025, were reviewed. A typo was found and will be corrected. Discussion of whether to read the minutes aloud occurred, but it was decided to not do this at this time. Charles Polacek moved to accept the corrected minutes; seconded by Kathy Owen. The motion carried.

**VISIONING:** Kathy Scott presented a written report about Loads of Love. They have been having 6-7 regular customers with about 12 children. Positive feedback has been received. One of the women with multiple children was able to get a job. Total amount left from the initial anonymous donation and monthly additions is \$274.50. After the October Loads of Love, they will need to start using the congregation donations which are about \$1000. Other sources of income are being researched. They are currently at maximum capacity of machine use on that day. Kathy Scott had a project in her SAM training to interview a youth. She ordered a study Bible and Lutheran study guide for confirmation. Lisa Streu made a motion; seconded by Charles Polacek to reimburse Kathy for the materials. Motion was approved.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** Mike Clark's workshop on scams will be Saturday. The annual meeting date needs to be pushed to November 23, 2025; committee reports deadline will be delayed to one week from original deadline. The proposed budget was reviewed and discussed. Charles Polacek made a motion; seconded by Dave Hahn to accept the proposed budget. Motion was approved. It will now be taken to the congregation at the annual meeting. Possible new council members were discussed. Dan Jones is the only confirmed replacement for the 3 open spots at this time. Discussion arose regarding potentially reducing the number of council members, which will be consistent with constitution guidelines.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Steve Kampen is resigning as financial secretary; thank you to him for his years of service. He will be replaced by Kathy Scott. New backups for Kathy and Charles as financial secretary and church treasurer, respectively, will need to be found after the first of the year. Microsoft Publisher will be eliminated as a program as of October 2026. We are currently using this to print our bulletins. Keisha has been experimenting with using Word to draft the bulletins. There are some issues in Word with printing two sizes (double the input, issue with hymns, etc.). Discussion occurred on solutions. Kathy Owen made a motion to just print a greater number of large print bulletins and eliminate the regular print ones effective immediately to accommodate the upcoming discontinuation of Publisher. Kathy Scott seconded the motion. The motion carried. There will be a Thanksgiving meal at church on Thanksgiving, pending confirmation that Dave and Sue Hahn will be in town to coordinate the meal.

Reformation Sunday is coming up; wear red please. The Sunday after that is All Saints Sunday. There will be a handout available to indicate names of friends/relatives who have passed away since last All Saints Sunday so they may be honored.

**CALL COMMITTEE:** Nothing new currently.

**EDUCATION:** No report.

EVANGELISM: Discussion of scheduling a blessing of pets again. Bazaar will be advertised on Talk of

the Town on November 4.

FINANCE: Written and oral reports given.

**PROPERTY:** Discussion of possibly power washing the back alcove by the office. It is dusty and dirty. Kathy and Mike Owen are donating a power washer to the church. There will be a meeting with the insurance agent to review the current policies and make sure they are up to date.

**SOCIAL MINISTRY:** Written food pantry report.

**STEWRDSHIP**: Nothing to report.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Special Sundays discussed earlier.

Motion made to accept Committee reports by Lisa Streu and seconded by Charles Polacek. Motion carried unanimously. Motion to adjourn was made by Charles Polacek and seconded by David Deterding. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 10:37 am The next council meeting will be Thursday, November 13, 2025, at 9:30 am. All prayed the Lord's Prayer together.

# HOLY CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY OCTOBER 2025 REPORT

In October, the food pantry served 20 households which included two new families. There were 40 individuals, with 7 between the ages of 0-17; 21 between the ages of 18-59 and 12 at the age of 60 or older. We served three veterans.

Our food pantry consists of six volunteers: Barb Kampen, Bob Hamilton, Marita Stanford, Jan Clark, Jan Pomeranke and Sue Gust. For the month of October the total volunteer hours were 46.50 hours. I appreciate their time and effort volunteering with the HCLC Food Pantry and helping to serve families in need of food assistance, here in Baxter County.

All donated food and money are greatly appreciated to help the families here in Baxter County. The families are allowed to come to the food pantry once a month. We are open the second and fourth Wednesday each month with the exception of holidays, the families are notified ahead of time any change in dates that they can come to get food.

The Love Offering for the month of December will go to Loads of Love, which is free laundry for families in need, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month located at A+ Laundry, 1211 Commerce Dr., Mountain Home, AR.

The balance of the HCLCFP credit account at the Food Bank of North Central Arkansas is at \$538.22. The current checking account balance of the HCLCFP at First Security Bank is \$10,677.42 as of 10/31/25. Deposits were \$150.00 and expenses were \$534.74.

For the month of December, the food pantry will be open on Wednesday, Dec, 10 and Dec. 17. We will be closed on Wednesday, Christmas Eve.
